The Great Lakes St. Lawrence Governors & Premiers (GSGP) are leading an initiative to promote the health benefits of tree planting in urban areas. GSGP has been working with Cleveland Clinic, Western Reserve Land Conservancy, and Cleveland Tree Coalition to develop information materials about these benefits and to plant trees in low canopy areas of the city. This project, generously supported by the Cleveland Foundation, is part of the <u>Great Lakes St. Lawrence</u> <u>Trees Initiative</u>, which aims to plant 250 million trees in the region by 2033.
